# <u>Principal's Report - Mrs. Hoffman (Principal Vice President):</u>

- Week of respect kicked off this AM. Discussed the theme days of the week on the first live Wake Up Willard. Touched on all the various ways we can show respect to one another during our spirit week.
- Walking school bus a great success last week, again this coming friday through the 24th of Oct.
- NJ schools participating in a pilot for the NJSLA adaptive testing. Grades 4th and 5th from Willard participating. No true feedback will be received by our school. This is an opportunity to be involved in and experience some of the new testing the state is developing. We will be reviewing the results for the state and analyzing how the school grades perform overall.
- Jessica Fishbeyn, our Gifted & Talented teacher and lead, is starting to visit classrooms - beginning in the 3rd grade.

- Students from last year did receive their NJSLA reports. Our school is aligned with other schools in our district. Administration has reviewed results and takes that data to reflect on how our school is doing and analyze where we may have gaps. We meet as grade level teams, and meet with supervisors in the district to reflect on student performance and future needs.
- Parents will be receiving access to our LinkIt portal so that parents can view our fall universal screenings. The parents will have access to review these online, and teachers will also discuss these fall evaluations at their scheduled upcoming goal setting conferences.

## <u>President's Report - Erin Jacques Franzese, Mary Sepassi & Lauren Jester:</u>

- GroupSpot directory is live! Access has been granted to dues paying members.
  - Should be 264 Dues paying families (we have a few duplicates Melissa/Danielle will need to refund 2 people sent them the names.
    - Melissa/Danielle has refunded those people who had paid twice ... Thank you Treasurers!
  - This represents approximately 85% of families, which is slightly down from the approximate 90% of dues paying families last year (even compared to the same time of year).
    - Notes: Exercise is worth it to calculate numbers and also check against GroupSpot because once the directory goes live, families recognize who and perhaps who has not paid their dues.
- Discussed putting solar powered motion detector lights on the outdoor classroom, sent some options to Mrs. Hoffman - got approval for one and will order and proceed with installation.
  - Looking to purchase and get those installed.
- Custodian Appreciation Day left a basket of snacks for the day & night custodians & gave our wonderful head custodian an extra gift.
- Outdoor awning project is still under review.
  - Near the 1st grade door / the outdoor lunch area with the picnic tables; beautification of that area. We have had meetings since the summer and with vendors, continuing to discuss possibilities.

- Class Parent Email: Initial welcome email sent to all class parents for distribution, once emails for all parents in each class were approved and finalized. The process was followed as directed by the district. First email was sent 9/24/25. To date all classes have circulated the email to their classes.
- Our crossing guards are very appreciative to know we are encouraging pedestrian, biking and cross walk safety with our reminders during Wake Up Willard. Discussions have focused around concerns for bikers who may not follow the traffic laws closely (i.e. bikes are to yield, just as vehicles are required, when a crossing stop sign is being used).

#### Public Questions:

- Question: Why isn't every meeting a public meeting? (References an online social media discussion re: transparency of HSA meetings.)
  - Erin and Mary's comments: Other HSAs may use their meetings in different ways. Our monthly meetings are more logistical and we use

- these meetings to review the agenda, and various updates to our upcoming events.
- We have added two additional public meetings over the past few years and we encourage attendance to provide a forum for questions and to help our committees brainstorm ideas. We do engage with parents through our various volunteer opportunities and encourage direct feedback from their experiences helping with those events at and around the school.
- We hope all Willard families feel free to reach out and ask questions whenever they may need. If additional public meetings should serve a greater need, we are happy to schedule and hold as needed.
- Mrs. Hoffman's comments: Over the 12 years I have been here at Willard, we have always encouraged public meetings and participation from our families. We started with one public meeting a year, and we are now at three. Some other schools have an executive meeting to review their logistical updates, and then a few days later meet publicly. If there is a reason to vote on something, that would happen at a public meeting. There has not been a strong interest in holding additional meetings to those we have scheduled, but we have offered meeting opportunities on other days / times and in the past have offered an evening meeting to accommodate parents. If there is an interest to revisit these ideas, we are happy to hear those thoughts. We always welcome everyone's input.
- Additional discussion / thoughts: If there is interest in hearing from our staff on the curriculum, we would be happy to arrange for a speaker at the upcoming public meetings. Perhaps allocate 15 minutes and hear on focused topics from our educators.
- Stacy Taranto (past HSA president) comments via Zoom: We have also posted public meeting minutes from each public meeting. To note, these minutes are rarely opened by our families.
- Discussion re: G&T Program:
  - Building the Gifted & Talented program to meet the needs of all students.

- Mrs. Hoffman comments: Working closely with Jessica Fishbeyn, our G&T teacher and lead on the program development. How can we also meet those students who may benefit from enrichment resources, in addition to those who truly qualify for G&T. Starting with 3rd grade this week.
- Idea: Ask Mrs. Fishbeyn to come speak at one of our HSA meetings.
- Meeting with G&T staff across the district and very excited things to come. Mrs. Hoffman to keep us posted.
- Questions have come to an end. No virtual questions today.
- Additional comments from Mrs. Hoffman at the close of the meeting:
  - Our safety patrol started today: our 5th grade helpers are very enthusiastic to step into these roles to help our students start their day safely at our entrances. The leadership committee met as well, and the tech crew was involved this AM to help with our live Wake Up Willard.
  - We are continuing to recognize those students who are shining bright.
     Students are very interested in achieving this goal and recognition.
